Subject: INFORMATION: 2017 Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate

Course Enrollment and Exam Participation and Performance

This memorandum provides you the information related to Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) courses enrollment and exam participation and performance in the 2016–2017 school year. Furthermore, AP/IB exam participation and performance of Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) students is benchmarked with the results of public school students in Maryland and the nation.

#### Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate Course Enrollment in MCPS

MCPS is committed to ensuring students' access and opportunities to advanced-level courses. AP and IB courses serve as key components for a rigorous instructional program as well as a foretaste for college-level courses. Students who take AP or IB courses may participate in exams related to the course content. An AP exam score of 3 or higher or an IB exam score of 4 or higher is considered college ready. In 2017, all 25 MCPS comprehensive high schools offered AP courses and 8 schools provided IB programs (Table A1 in the Attachment). Of all 25 high schools, 13 schools offered 30 or more AP/IB courses. Richard Montgomery (68), Bethesda-Chevy Chase (60), and Springbrook (54) high schools were the three high schools offering the most AP/IB courses.




Figure 1. Percentage of MCPS High School Students Enrolled in at Least One Advanced Placement/International Baccalaureate Course from 2015 to 2017

Districtwide, nearly half of MCPS high school students enrolled in at least one AP or IB course in 2017 (Figure 1). In the past three years, AP/IB course enrollment increased 2.3 percentage points. Given the number of AP/IB course offerings differ by high school, it is prudent to compare the AP/IB course enrollment across schools with caution. The details of AP/IB course enrollment in each high school can be found in Table A2 in the Attachment.

In 2017, less than 45.0 percent of male students in MCPS high schools enrolled in at least one AP/IB course, while approximately 55.0 percent of female students enrolled in one or more courses (Table 1). Among racial/ethnic groups, 69.0 percent of Asian, 63.5 percent of White, and 58.0 percent of Two or More Races students enrolled in one or more AP/IB courses, whereas the AP/IB course enrollment rates for Black or African American and Hispanic/Latino students were lower with enrollment rates of 38.4 and 31.3 percent, respectively. Approximately 29 percent of high school students who received Free and Reduced-price Meals System (FARMS) services enrolled in at least one AP/IB course. The AP/IB course enrollment rates were less than 15 percent for those receiving Special Education (12.5 percent) and Limited English Proficiency (LEP) services (14.3 percent). From 2015 to 2017, nearly all student groups demonstrated increases in enrollment in AP/IB courses; Black or African American and Two or More Races students' enrollment increased nearly 5.0 percentage points, while enrollment in AP/IB courses remained steady (0.9 percentage point decrease) for students receiving LEP services.

# Advanced Placement Exam Participation and Performance: MCPS, Maryland, and the Nation

The continued emphasis on rigorous course-taking resulted in 36,463 AP exams taken by MCPS students in 2017 (see Table B1 in the Attachment). The number of AP exams taken by MCPS students in 2017 accounted for 33.1 percent of all those taken by Maryland public school students, and the number of AP exams with scores of 3 or higher taken by MCPS students accounted for 38.5 percent of all those in Maryland.




Figure 2. Percentage of Advanced Placement Exams with a Score of 3 or Higher Taken by Public School Students in MCPS, Maryland, and the Nation in 2017

The percentage of AP exams taken by MCPS students who attained scores of 3 or higher (73.4 percent) was 10.3 and 17.3 percentage points greater than those for public school students in the state of Maryland (63.1 percent) and the nation (56.1 percent), respectively (Figure 2).

MCPS students of all racial/ethnic groups exceeded the percentage of AP exams with scores of 3 or higher compared with the public school students in the state of Maryland and the nation. Particularly noteworthy was the percentage of AP exams taken by MCPS Black or African American students earning scores of 3 or higher (49.6 percent), which was 14.8 and 21.2 percentage points greater than those in the state (34.8 percent) and the nation (28.4 percent), respectively (Table 2).

# Advanced Placement Exam Participation and Performance Trends: MCPS, Maryland, and the Nation

From 2015 to 2017, the number of AP exams taken by MCPS students increased by 2,909 tests (Table 3). A similar upward trend was observed in Maryland and the nation. Likewise, the number of AP exams taken by each racial/ethnic group in MCPS and the nation increased. In Maryland, the number of AP exams taken by Asian (843 more tests) and Hispanic/Latino (3,241 more tests) public school students increased; however, the number of exams taken by Black or African American (803 fewer tests) and White (1,920 fewer tests) students decreased. Because AP information for Two or More Races students in Maryland and the nation was not available in 2015, the trend analysis between 2015 and 2017 cannot be provided for this student group.

The percentage of AP exams with a score of 3 or higher taken by public school students in MCPS (0.8 percentage point decrease) and the nation (0.2 percentage point increase) remained steady from 2015 to 2017, while the AP exam performance rate increased 2.0 percentage points for students in Maryland (Table 3). In MCPS, there was little change among racial/ethnic groups other than a decline for Black or African American and Two or More Races. In Maryland, the percentage of AP exam performance trended upward for all racial/ethnic groups; however, the increase for Maryland Black or African American (0.7 percentage point) students was close to unchanged. In the nation, the AP exam performance rate was stable for most racial/ethnic groups, while the rate for Asian students increased 1.8 percentage points.

#### **Advanced Placement Exam Participation and Performance: MCPS High Schools**

MCPS high schools continued to support AP exam participation and performance of minority students. Between 2015 and 2017, 19 of the 25 high schools observed an increase in the number of AP exams taken by Black or African American students and 20 of the 25 high schools experienced an increase in the number of AP exams taken by Hispanic/Latino students. In 12 of the 25 high schools there was an increase in the percentage of AP exams with a score of 3 or higher taken by Black or African American students and in 9 of the 25 high schools gains in the percentage of AP exams with a score of 3 or higher taken by Hispanic/Latino students. Eight of the 25 high schools noted increases for both AP exam participation and performance for Black or African American students; of those, Poolesville High School demonstrated the greatest improvement (11.4 percentage points) in these students earning AP exam scores of 3 or higher. Eight of the 25 high schools exhibited increases for both AP exam participation and performance for Hispanic/Latino students; among these schools, Wheaton High School recorded the largest increase (15.8 percentage points) in these students earning AP exam scores of 3 or higher.

In 2017, the 20 AP exams most frequently taken by students in MCPS were: U.S. Government and Politics, English Language and Composition, World History, Psychology, English Literature and Composition, Calculus AB, U.S. History, Statistics, Calculus BC, Biology, Environmental Science, Spanish Language, Chemistry, Microeconomics, Computer Science Principles, Macroeconomics, Human Geography, Computer Science A, Physics C: Mechanics, and Physics 1 (Table C1).

At least three student groups saw gains from 2015 to 2017 in both the number of exams taken and the percentage of AP exam scores of 3 or higher in Physics C, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, U.S. History, World History, Computer Science A, and Spanish Language. The number of exams taken and the percentage of AP exam scores of 3 or higher increased in Microeconomics, World History, Computer Science A, and Spanish Language for Black or African American students. Among Hispanic/Latino students, the number of AP exams taken and the percentage of AP exam scores of 3 or higher improved in English Language and Composition, Calculus AB, Biology, Chemistry, Microeconomics, U.S. History, and World History. Computer Science Principles was not included in the trend analysis because it was a new test offered in 2017.

#### **International Baccalaureate Exam Participation and Performance Trends: MCPS**

In addition to AP courses, MCPS offers IB programs at eight high schools. The number of IB exams taken by MCPS students increased from 3,066 in 2015 to 3,770 in 2017, corresponding to a 23-percent increase (Table 4). The same upward trend was evidenced among all racial/ethnic groups. The number of IB exams taken by Black or African American and Hispanic/Latino students increased by 225 and 264 tests, respectively. The percentage of IB exams with scores of 4 or higher taken by MCPS students decreased 3.0 percentage points

in the last three years. The trend of IB performance varied by racial/ethnic groups. Among the racial/ethnic groups, the percentage of IB exams with a score of 4 or higher taken by White students noted the largest increase (4.2 percentage points), while the rate for Hispanic/Latino students saw the greatest decline (7.0 percentage points).

The positive trends in AP and IB exam participation and performance provide evidence of MCPS' continuing efforts to engage students in challenging and college-level contents for students of all races/ethnicities and to prepare them for college readiness. The attached tables include additional AP and IB exam information. Appendix A details the AP/IB course offering and course enrollment by high school and student group. Appendix B provides data on AP exam participation and performance among groups of students enrolled in MCPS schools, and public school students in Maryland and the nation. Appendix C describes the 20 most popular AP exams taken by MCPS students. Appendix D delineates information of IB exam participation and performance in MCPS.
