## *Bannockburn Elementary's Second Geography Bee*

Get ready Globe-trotters! Bannockburn Elementary School will hold its second Geography Bee for 4th and 5th graders on January 14, 2005!

National Geographic sponsors the Bee for 4th - 8th graders annually. Pyle middle school students automatically participate in the Bee. The Bee starts at the elementary school level, continues to the state level, and results in a national competition.

The Geography Bee generates student enthusiasm for geography with this challenging and fun competition. The Bee is a partnership with the National Geo-spatial intelligence Agency (formerly NIMA, now called NGA). NGA volunteers will again serve as moderators for the Bee, along with parent volunteers as scorekeepers and timekeepers.

For our initial year, we modified the format; however, this year we will follow the format set by National Geographic. This includes preliminary rounds by individual classes scheduled for Friday, January 7th at 1:30 pm, which will determine ten finalists (to include 4th and 5th graders).

Prior to the preliminary rounds in December, fourth and fifth grade teachers will hold a practice session. The final competition will be conducted in the multi-purpose room on Friday, January 14th at 1:30 pm. All 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders will be present to cheer on their fellow classmates. Parents are also invited.

Ms. Anita Hardy, Media Center, will again assist us in sponsoring an individual class Bee competition (4th and 5th graders) through the WBES morning program, as a kick-off to the Bee. The class who answers the most correct questions will win an ice cream party sponsored by the PTA.

Now is the time to help your student brush up on geography facts for the Bee. Start by reviewing the websites below, especially the GEOBEE website which has daily questions posted from previous Bees. The whole family will enjoy looking at maps, World Atlases, and playing the GeoBee Challenge Board game – available at Target.

## *Check Out The New And Improved BES Courtyard*

On Saturday, October 23, some 50 BES parents and kids took part in a major makeover of an underused and underappreciated part of our school – the courtyard. Have you noticed this wonderful resource? Every interior classroom has a door that opens into it. There are two double doors from the lobby and the gym hall into it. So why hasn't it been used?

The PTA put up some money and Principal Kim Bosnic found some funds and the labor came free from a lot of the school community.

- First, we cut down all the scrub trees, pricker bushes, and the large, rotted maple that was in there.
- A group dug up all the weedy mess around the other maple tree, mulched it all, and managed to save several azaleas and pieris that were there.
- Another group built a small flagstone patio outside the teacher's lounge.
- Three yews were planted along the gym-side wall, and a nice River Birch in front of them.
- Chris Solloway installed two new rain barrels on the downspouts behind the butterfly garden.
- A group dug a large hole in the kindergarten courtyard and planted a 20-foot tall Chinese Paperbark Elm in honor of Ms. Butler. A plaque is to come.
- We planted a new butterfly garden along the entire back wall of the courtyard, with abelia, Joe Pye weed, lavender, a lilac bush and more.
- Throughout the entire area, we laid dozens of large river rocks and some huge boulders.
- The old pond was cleaned out, landscaped and refilled, and a new pump and fountain installed.
- We also placed two new teak benches in the amphitheater. (Did you know there was one out there?)

A big thank you to Sarah Davis of John Shorb Landscaping (mom to Catie and Lia) for her assistance in purchasing the trees and some plants, and the loan of a ball cart for moving big rocks. Thanks to all the other parents and kids, too. It was an amazing effort, and a great use of school funds. If you could have seen Louise Crawford mucking out the pond in her Wellington boots, or Kevin Rackstraw wrestling with gnarled tree roots, or Dawn Page personally digging a 10-foot wide hole for the Butler Tree...

Please go see the results. Teachers love it, and many have already taken their classes out there. They wrote a poem to the PTA to thank them. Cathy Baker and Beth Zangwell's scout troops are planting bulbs now, too. Wait until spring!

#### *Anxiety and Stress in Children*

The workshop on stress and anxiety in children on Wednesday, October 27 was very well attended. It was obvious that this topic is an important issue with our children and their parents. Sonya Braverman, LCSW-C presented on the subject and gave parents a useful packet of information. Extra packets are available in the counselor's office upon request.

## *BES Raises \$7,500 For*

### *The Homeless*

Over 140 BES registered walkers participated in the October 20th Walk for the Homeless at recess. It was a cold, dreary day, but all the students had smiles on their faces and enthusiastically walked, ran, walked backwards, skipped, walked hand-in-hand, cheered, and had a great time. The walk was preceded by a lunchtime speaker from the Montgomery County Coalition for the Homeless and lap signs during the walk also raised students' awareness of the needs of homeless families and children in our community. Our Community Service theme this year "BES cares and shares" was certainly demonstrated by the \$7,500 raised through registrations and matching grants. We will be partnering with the Coalition on other community service events throughout the year.

In November, BES participated in the county-wide Harvest for the Hungry food drive. We kicked off this "Kids Helping Kids" program through our trick or treat food collection at school on the day of the Halloween parade and parties. BES successfully collected several hundred pounds of food that was donated to the Manna food bank to provide food to families throughout Montgomery County. Thanks to the initiative of Ruth Rabner, BES also participated in the "Reuse a Shoe" project sponsored by Nike and the National Recycling Program in November. Through this program, donated sneakers are used to make composite basketball courts in needy neighborhoods. The kids get the double message of giving to others and the need to reuse/recycle to help the environment.

Thank you to all students, parents and staff for the continued support of the Community Service activities.
