PBHS Principal’s Message -- July 2003

Dear Panthers, Parents and Guardians:

At the May 20th, 2003 meeting of the PTSA, it was agreed that during the 2003-2004 school year, Paint Branch will have one lunch/activity period (LAP) of 45 minutes. Given that 186 seniors will be leaving the campus early for internships and work, it was agreed that there will be a gradual consideration of allowing **seniors (only) who have signed permission from their parent/guardian** to be able to leave campus according to the following schedule:

First marking period (August 26th – November 3rd), seniors who have signed parent/guardian permission will be allowed to walk to the Briggs Chaney Center (Pizza Hut, 7 Eleven, and various other restaurants). If this goes well . . .

Second marking period (November 4th – January 23rd), seniors who have signed parent/guardian permission will be able to walk to Briggs Chaney Center and on November 21st, December 19th, and January 9th, seniors will be able to drive off the campus for lunch. If this goes well . . .

Beginning second semester (January 28th), seniors with signed parent permission will be able to walk and drive off campus for lunch.

Students are not permitted to cross Route 29 and Briggs Chaney Road on foot during the lunch period. Students who violate this rule will be subject to suspension.

**Following is the text from Ms. Dixon's Graduation Speech on June 4, 2003,
Celebrating Unity, Diversity, and Achievement**

Mr. Felton, Dr. Weast, Ms. Marks, Members of the Paint Branch Staff, Parents, Relatives and Friends of the Class of 2003, and soon-to-be graduates of Paint Branch High School:

We are honored by your presence on this joyous day---the 32nd Paint Branch High School Commencement.

On behalf of all of us at Paint Branch, I want to thank the parents and guardians of the Class of 2003. Our students will receive their high school diplomas today as a direct result of your love and support. If you are the parent or guardian of a member of the class of 2003, please stand so that we may acknowledge and thank you.

I also want to thank the Paint Branch staff for educating and guiding the Class of 2003 over the past 4 years. The personal connections you have made with our students enrich their lives. Please stand so that we may acknowledge you. We are also honored by the presence of some of my principal colleagues in the middle and elementary schools of the Northeast Consortium.

While students, staff, parents and administrators have been challenged by code blue, code red, the snow and wars in Afghanistan and Iraq our seniors chose to focus on unity and achievement despite having many of their activities cancelled. It is fitting therefore that this commencement is a celebration of the unity, diversity and achievement of the class but also a celebration of the resilience and courage of the class in carrying on in spite of the obstacles faced this school year.

The graduating class of 370 students is diverse. 40% are African-American, 19.2 % are Asian-American, 5.7% are Hispanic and 35.1% are white. Our students were born in 32 different countries, speaking 15 languages other than English. They hail from a multitude of different religious backgrounds. Their achievements are numerous. The class of 2003 completed 59,000 hours of community service, took 586 advanced placement tests---the highest number in Paint Branch history; and won \$1,800,000 in first year scholarships to colleges like Duke, Xavier, University of Maryland, University of Pa, Morehouse, Cornell, Georgetown, Art Institute of Philadelphia, Montgomery College, Morgan State, Penn State, Smith College, Lehigh, Va. Tech, Brown, and Washington University in St. Louis among others. Nine students will serve our country in the armed forces. In athletics the class of 2003 excelled in girls' basketball, and won regional and state championships in track, and divisional championships in wrestling and baseball. This year we implemented the Gilder-Lehrman American History Scholars program. During 2003-2004 we will implement new programs in the Academy of Finance and a naval NJROTC unit.

I am also impressed with our graduating students who have overcome adversity---homelessness, divorce, death of a parent, childbirth at a young age, living alone, fleeing from war torn countries, and attending night and Saturday school in addition to day school. To those whom Ms. Waits dragged to the finish line---we are proud of you.

To the Class of 2003: When you leave here today, I hope you will say thank you to those who helped you along the way. I hope you will continue to serve others, and not only tolerate but embrace others who are different from you. In her book, "The Measure of Our Success," Marian Wright Edelman writes about 25 lessons for life. I am struck by the 10th lesson as we celebrate diversity-Edelman asks us to "Remember, and help America remember that the fellowship of human beings is more important than the fellowship of race and class and gender in a democratic society." Diversity is not only an abstract notion to be celebrated; rather it is a way of life that should be ardently pursued. As a class you exemplify the fellowship of human beings and I hope this will be your guiding principle as you head off united by your graduation today, to college, the military and the world of work.

We look for you to do great things as you make your mark in life and improve the world. As you go about improving the world, I hope you will always demonstrate compassion to those who receive none, and never forget that the sacrifices of one person can change the world.

Thank you and God Bless the Class of 2003.

- **Plan ahead and budget your money.**
