Edwidge Danticat



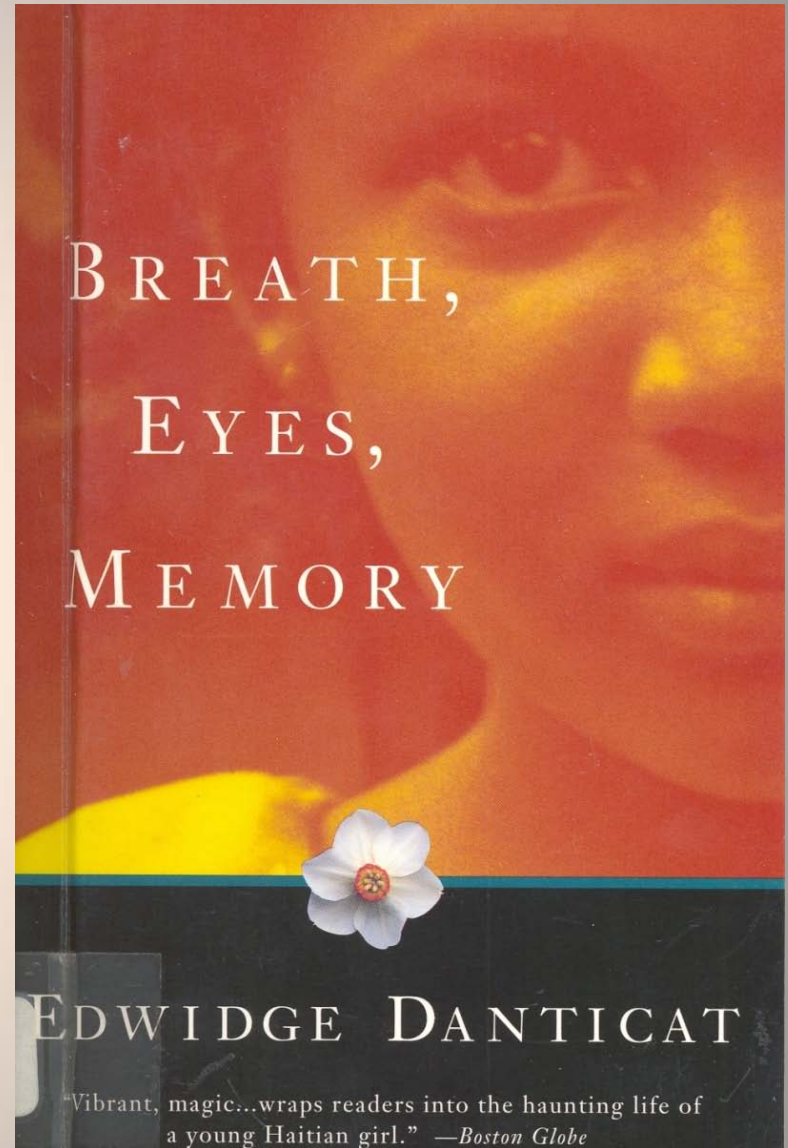
Edwidge Danticat emigrated from Haiti to New York City in 1981.

She writes with realism of the corruption, terror, and poverty, yet leaves you with a feeling of enduring hope and faith.

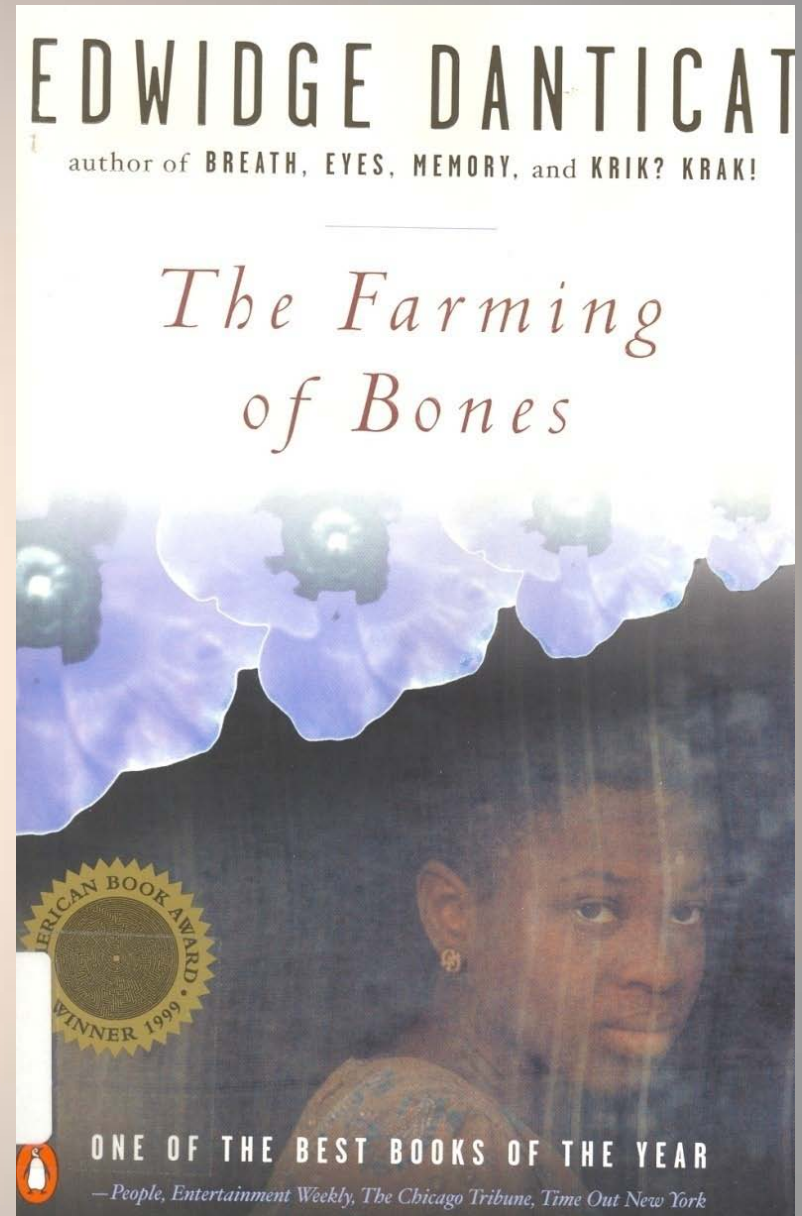
