If elected, what are your top three non-budgetary priorities you wish to see completed during your term? What actions/steps would be needed to obtain them?

- 1. The SMOB can be an incredibly powerful force on the Board. Having access to many resources, including an Advisory Council, I'll lobby intensely to gain full SMOB voting rights from the state legislature. If we want to be a trendsetter in education, the SMOB needs to have a vote on the budget, not just a voice. To carry out this momentous task, student organizations across MCPS must join forces, because our greatest asset is our numbers.
- I will create a scholarship/opportunities/resources database to allow MCPS students to reach that next level of education or explore their individual interests of becoming small business owners, pilots, EMTs, authors, or any other path they choose.
- Finally, I will increase communication between the SMOB and students by hosting more Town Halls and working effectively with the countywide student newspaper, the MoCo Student.

Even though the Student Member of the Board currently does not have a vote on the MCPS budget, they do have an active role in expressing the student's voice in it. If you could allocate an additional five million dollars anywhere in the budget, where would it be and why?

The \$5 million dollars would be used to create a scholarship fund for students on the basis of their community service and community involvement. If scholarships were \$5,000 each, we would directly impact the lives of a thousand students. I believe in tangible results—change we can see with our own two eyes.
