Due to increasing financial pressure, what programs would you insist on keeping fully funded and what would you consider sacrificing?

Our teachers, administrators, and support staff are extremely important to the school system. However, this year's list of potential budget cuts includes academic intervention, staff development, Reading Recovery, and instrumental music teachers as well as counselors, assistant school administrators, and security staff. All of these people are integral to the school system, and I oppose any future cuts that would similarly hurt our education. I also support funding athletics, Outdoor Education, activity buses, and magnet transportation. However, in order to endure this economic crisis, I support eliminating wasteful expenditures, promoting environmentally friendly practices, and delaying new initiatives.

The SMOB is one of eight members on the Board of Education, so he or she has a fraction of the total vote. Many SMOBs make campaign promises. However, acknowledging this limited power, how would you be able to best address student issues and fulfill your campaign promises?

Last year, I promised the students of Montgomery County that I would fight for their budget and find a communicative superintendent. Throughout my term, I collaborated with the other Board members on the superintendent search while dealing with serious budget issues and fighting for expanded voting rights. Using these experiences, I'll continue to expand the SMOB Council initiative to increase communication with students through a centralized website and monthly SMOB reports in school newspapers. I'm also scheduling a series of countywide town hall events and individual school visits.
