In all grades, studies need not be memorized, and no extra marks will be awarded for memory. For complete details on examination requirements, please consult each grade.


#### General Instructions

- All scales and arpeggios are to be played from memory, ascending and descending, with the required bowings.
- Intonation, tone quality, and fluency are important factors in the evaluation of a candidate's performance of technical tests.
- · Metronome markings indicate suggested speeds.

#### Three-Octave Scales

- Candidates in Grades 6, 7, and 8 may play threeoctave scales using any one of the three patterns in the following example.
- Candidates in Grades 9 and 10 must use the Galamian-style pattern (pattern "a").



#### Bethesda-Chevy Chase High School IB Music Graded Lists – Repertoire Clarification

When selecting solos from the MBDA and MODA lists, please refer to the following guideline of graded solos which compares to the graded list in the RCM (Royal Conservatory of Music) handbook. A selection must be chosen that is comparable to the same grade in each of the lists.

MBDA / MODA list Grade 1	is equal to	RCM list Grade level 1 and 2
Grade 2	is equal to	Grade level 3 and 4
Grade 3	is equal to	Grade level 5 and 6
Grade 4	is equal to	Grade level 7 and 8
Grade 5	is equal to	Grade level 8 and 9
Grade 6	is equal to	Grade level 9 and 10

#### EAR TESTS

#### Rhythm

Candidates will be asked to clap or tap the rhythm of a short melody after it has been played *twice* by the examiner.

– time signatures:  $\frac{2}{4}$  or  $\frac{3}{4}$ 



#### Melody Playback

Candidates will be asked to play back a four-note melody, either on their own instrument or on the piano. The melody will be based on the first three notes of a major scale and may contain one or more leaps of a 3rd. The examiner will name the key, play the tonic triad *once*, and play the melody *twice*.

- beginning note: tonic or supertonic
- keys: D or G major
