Mrs. O'Neill asked for a detailed report on the status of middle school music and the changes in staffing and programs for chorus and instrumental music. Please include in the report the reasons for reducing the program, such as budget or decline in enrollment.

Regarding loss of credit, Mrs. Navarro wanted to know the requirements for notification to parents, communication with non-English speaking parents, and what is the mechanism to "red flag" loss of credit.

Re: **SUPERINTENDENT/BOARD COMMENTS**

Dr. Haughey commented that this was the last meeting for George Margolies, staff director for the Board of Education. He will leave to become Chief of Staff in Anne Arundel Public Schools. He served the Board for 11 years, and he has rendered exemplary service. The Board benefitted from his work, and the Board members valued his friendship. The Board president wished Mr. Margolies success in his new endeavors. Individually, Board members offered their thanks and best wishes to Mr. Margolies.

Dr. Weast offered his well wishes to Mr. Margolies as he moved to Anne Arundel County. He further commented that students participating in the Extended Learning Opportunities (ELO) program this summer and their families have received Learning Tool Kits and books donated by the Montgomery County Public Schools Retirees Association. The materials are designed to help extend the learning experiences of the summer program in Title I schools into the home environment. More than 6,000 new and slightly used books were collected and sorted by retiree association members for distribution to all the ELO schools.

932 kindergarten families received tool kits containing magnetic letters, crayons, Play Doh, a number line, calendar, a book, and parent information on suggested ways to use the kit.

Dr. Weast continued to comment that the Maryland State Department of Education, with support and preliminary approval from the U. S. Department of Education, will offer high school students another option for passing the State's end-of-course High School Assessments (HSA) when classes begin this fall. State Superintendent of Schools Dr. Nancy S. Grasmick said students who take certain Advanced Placement (AP) or International Baccalaureate (IB) exams will be able to meet the HSA graduation requirement if they receive a score of three or higher on the AP exam or a score of four or higher on the IB exam. Students will need to take specific AP and IB exams in order to make a substitution. Maryland is among the first states in the nation to offer this option to students.

According to the College Board, the number of Maryland students taking AP exams has increased by 70% in the last five years. In January 2005, the College Board ranked Maryland number two in the nation in the proportion of graduating seniors who received a college-mastery score on one or more AP exams. Many colleges award full college credit to students for certain courses if they receive a score of three or better on the AP 5-point scale.

Students who entered grade nine in 2005, this year's tenth graders, are required to pass Maryland High School Assessments in English 2, algebra/data analysis, biology and government to receive their high school diploma. Students in grades 11 and 12 are only required to take the assessments in order to graduate and may substitute taking the AP and IB exams as well.

The U. S. Department of Education granted flexibility to Maryland last year to allow the substitute tests for certain students with the anticipation that full approval for all students would be forthcoming once the State completed comparison studies between the AP/IB exams and the High School Assessments. The results of those studies are expected to be sent to USDE before schools open this fall.

Mrs. O'Neill remarked that she had been serving on an HSA work group for those students who will not be able to pass, and she wanted to know what is the strategy for those students. There are students that score much higher on other tests, and the idea was to use AP tests. With this new initiative, 3,200 students would not have taken the HSA.

Mr. Abrams remembered that several years MCPS asked the state if a more rigorous MCPS test could replace MSDE's test. At that time, the state was not receptive. Mr. Abrams was delighted to see the collaboration. He thought this could be the first step for a national standard in testing to meet the *No Child Left Behind* criteria.

Ms. Ervin had a concern about the imbalance of students taking the AP test and those students who are not enrolled in AP courses. Dr. Weast replied that those students taking the AP will be scored as 100 percent for HSA. Furthermore, he wanted to know if a student passed the HSA, could a student enroll in community college with a grade that meant something to the college. He knew that the AP score meant something, and the student would be placed appropriately. He thought the AccuPlacer would be a better test for use by the state.

Mrs. O'Neill pointed out that Maryland has to submit its assessment system to the U.S. Department of Education for approval. The state work group is very concerned that students will not pass the HSAs. It would be very helpful if the state superintendent could prevail on the federal government for substitute tests (SAT or PSAT). Dr. Weast stated that he will continue the debate since 18 states had exit exams with no correlation to school systems' curriculum or indicators for success.

Mr. Margolies thanked the Board for their kind remarks. He was excited for the opportunity to serve students through public education in Anne Arundel County. He stated that he would miss his MCPS colleagues. He thanked the Board for their support and the opportunity to serve the community.

WHEREAS, The low bidders have also submitted 6.6 percent non-MDOT-certified other minority participation; and

WHEREAS, The state minority business requirements for school construction projects stipulate that only MDOT-certified minority businesses can be used to satisfy the state MBE goal of 25 percent; and

WHEREAS, Waiver requests for the balance of the MBE participation have been received; and

WHEREAS, Department of Facilities Management staff has reviewed and certified that the waiver meets the contract requirements and recommends waiving the remaining balance of the MDOT-certified MBE participation; and

WHEREAS, The construction management contract contains provisions that permit the Montgomery County Public Schools to assign the trade contracts that are awarded by the Board of Education to the construction manager’s contract; now therefore be it

Re: **MONTROSE CENTER – SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT WITH GRAFTON SCHOOL**

WHEREAS, The Grafton School entered a lease for a portion of the former Montrose Elementary School on August 17, 1998; and

WHEREAS, The lease was amended on September 18, 1999, to enable the Grafton School to accept a grant from the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; and

WHEREAS, During the 2005-2006 school year, the Grafton School closed its program at the former Montrose Elementary School for financial reasons and asked to be released from its lease obligations; and

WHEREAS, Staff has negotiated a Settlement Agreement providing for the lease termination on July 31, 2006; and

WHEREAS, The Grafton School has agreed to pay their pro rata share of operating expenses until lease termination, to complete painting and repairs to the leased space, to forfeit its interest in the Facility Maintenance Reserve Fund for the Montrose Center to which it contributed along with the Lourie Center, and to indemnify the Board of Education for any acts or omissions committed during the lease term; and

WHEREAS, The Grafton School has reached a separate agreement with Montgomery County to satisfy debt obligations for a state grant; now therefore be it

Resolved, That the president and secretary of the Board of Education be authorized to execute a Grafton School Settlement Agreement to terminate its lease at the former Montrose Elementary School.
