| <p>Carl Sandburg Learning Center (CSLC) is a separate, public, special education day school serving students in Kindergarten through Grade 5. Students with complex profiles are offered individualized instruction in literacy, math, science and social and emotional skill study. This countywide school provides a safe space for children with autism, communication challenges, specific learning, intellectual and/or emotional disabilities to access an outstanding Arts, adapted physical education, music, media and STEM program complete with an outdoor classroom. Students are provided with exceptional speech-language, occupational and physical therapy services in either an individual treatment or co-treat model. Children are pursuing either a high school diploma or a high school certificate of completion. CSLC is based on encouraging independence, resiliency and providing an environment rich in Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) with attention to acquiring and maintaining foundational academic skills.</p> |
