Subject: UPDATE: Student Performance on the 2011 Assessment Program in Primary Reading (Kindergarten to Grade 2)

In 2011, the percentage of kindergarten, Grade 1, and Grade 2 students who met or exceeded reading benchmarks on the Montgomery County Public Schools' (MCPS) Assessment Program in Primary Reading (AP-PR) continued to increase or remained steady. Especially noteworthy were the gains realized by kindergarten students of all racial/ethnic groups in achieving proficiency at Text Level 6, which corresponds with Key 1 of the Seven Keys to College Readiness. This year's AP-PR results continue to reflect the sustained progress MCPS is making in the realization of rigorous academic standards and building the foundation of success for all students.

The 2011 benchmark attainment for all kindergarten students was 91.6 percent, an increase of 10.7 percentage points since 2006. During the same period, Black or African American and Hispanic/Latino students surpassed the gains for all students, with gains of 13.1 and 12.4 percentage points, respectively (Table 1). From 2006 to 2011, the percentage of kindergarten students who attained the first key to college readiness at Text Level 6 climbed 20 percentage points to 76.3 percent. Impressive gains across years were posted among each of the racial/ethnic groups.

In 2009, the kindergarten benchmark was increased to Text Level 4 so district level results for 2006 were recalculated to show comparable data.

In 2011, 87.1 percent of all Grade 1 students met the benchmark, an increase of 11.5 percentage points since 2006. Greater gains were seen among Hispanic/Latino and Black or African American students—17.6 and 16.4 percentage points, respectively (Table 2).

In 2011, 74.2 percent of Grade 2 students met the benchmark, an increase of 12.9 percentage points since 2006. The rate of increase among Black or African American (14.0) and Hispanic/Latino (16.6) students surpassed that of all students, further evidence of progress toward closing the achievement gap (Table 2).
