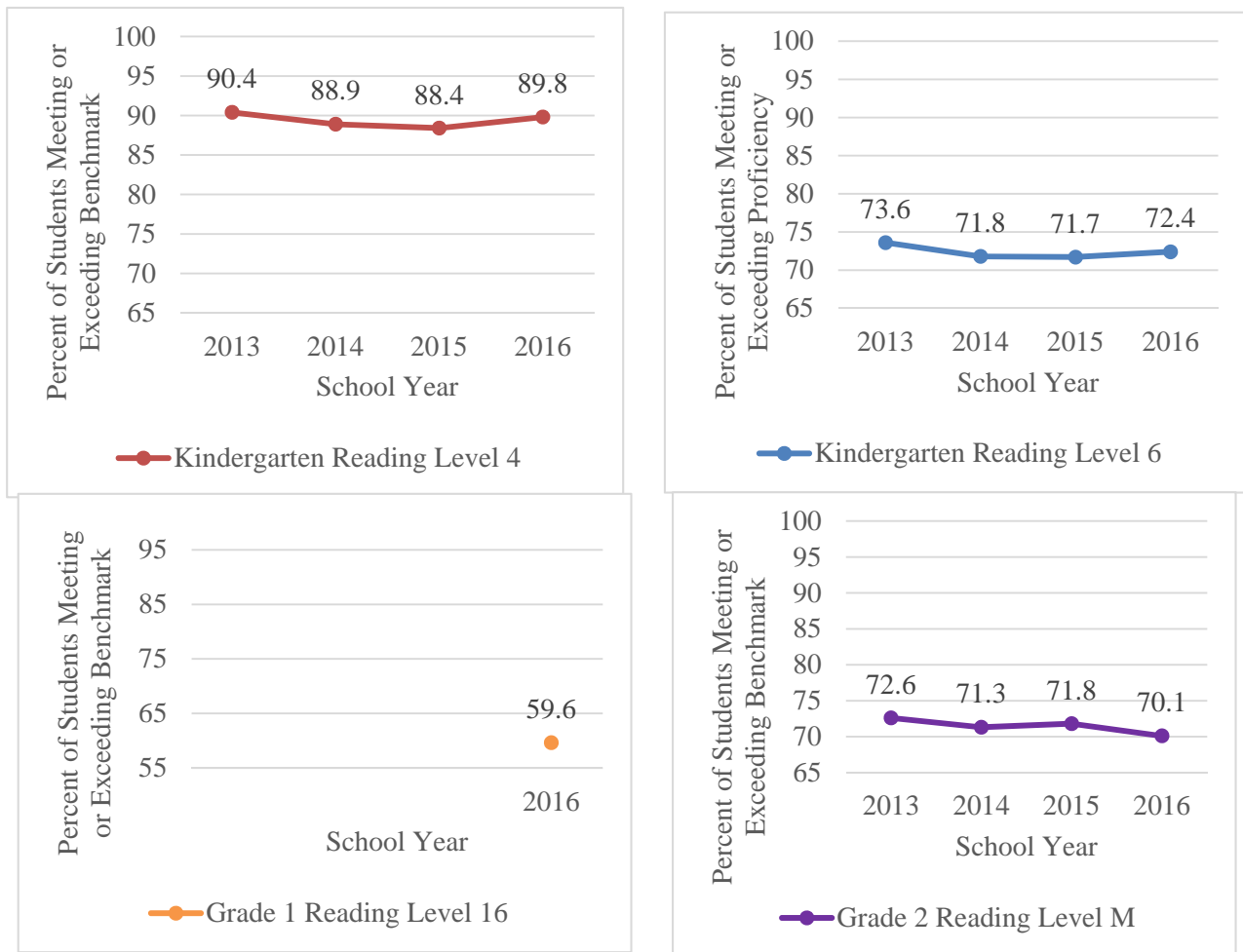
Subject: INFORMATION: Student Performance on the 2016 Assessment Program in Primary Reading (Kindergarten to Grade 2)

An emphasis on early reading has long been an essential part of Montgomery County Public Schools' (MCPS) strategy for equipping our students with the skills necessary to be successful in school. Over the years, we have closely monitored the data, invested in professional development, and reduced student-teacher ratios to provide more time for reading instruction. The reading progress of the primary grades has been monitored during the last few years through the Strategic Planning Framework Grade 3 milestone—*Reading at the proficient and advanced levels*.

To assess reading skills in the primary grades, MCPS administers the Assessment Program in Primary Reading (AP-PR) three times per year to provide continuous feedback on students' development in Text Reading and Comprehension (TRC) including accuracy, fluency, and oral and written comprehension. AP-PR is a combination of a locally developed assessment and a nationally norm-referenced assessment, reporting students' TRC levels on an interval scale indicating attainment of the grade-level reading benchmark and proficiency. While the written comprehension portion is part of the requirements for Grade 2 benchmark on AP-PR, MCPS started to require Grade 1 students to pass the written comprehension portion in school year of 2015–2016.

In order to turnaround the downward trend in the performance of AP-PR, a cross-functional Elementary Reading Data Monitoring Team was established three years ago to explore practices at schools and inform the work of a districtwide Elementary Literacy Instructional Core Team (ICT), established in the 2014–2015 school year. The ICT intensified the focus on data driven instruction and frequent monitoring of reading data. More specifically, the monthly Monitoring Instructional Reading Level tool was developed to allow teachers to collect formative assessment data during guided reading instruction. At the same time, principal curriculum update meetings as well as joint sessions for reading specialists and staff development teachers have focused on professional learning related to reading instruction.

The outcome of these efforts has revealed a halt of the sliding trend in AP-PR performance in recent two years (Figure 1). With an already negligible one-year decrease in 2015, kindergarteners demonstrated a slight one-year improvement in the percentage of meeting or exceeding the grade-level reading benchmark at Text Level 4 and proficiency at Text Level 6 in 2016. Low performance of Grade 1 students in 2016 reflected the addition of the written comprehension portion into the benchmark requirements. In Grade 2, a small one-year decrease in AP-PR performance in 2016 was indeed preceded by a slight one-year increase in 2015. Results of the 2016 AP-PR are presented below with comparison results from prior years.

## Kindergarten Performance

Approximately 90 percent of kindergarten students (89.8 percent) met or exceeded the grade-level reading benchmark at Text Level 4 in 2016, demonstrating a 1.4 percentage point increase from 2015 (88.4 percent) after the downward change occurring in prior years (Figure 1 and Table 1). Hispanic/Latino students gained more than three percentage points between 2015 and 2016, a more noticeable increase compared to a negligible increase from 2013 to 2016. There also was a small percentage increase between 2015 and 2016 for other racial/ethnic groups (less than one percentage point increase) despite a small decrease from 2013 to 2016, except that scores for Black or African American students continued to decrease by approximately one percentage point between 2015 and 2016. Kindergarten students of all service groups (i.e., students receiving Limited English Proficiency (LEP), Free and Reduced-price Meals System (FARMS), and special education services) increased the percentage attaining their grade-level reading benchmark between 2015 and 2016 (a 1.4 to 3.1 percentage point increase), while having a decreasing trend or a smaller increase from 2013 to 2016.

Regarding Text Level 6, 72.4 percent of kindergarten students achieved the reading proficiency level in 2016, a 0.7 percentage point increase compared to the percentage of 71.7 in 2015, contrasting to the downward trend between 2013 and 2016 (Figure 1 and Table 1). The small one-year increase in 2016 was attributed to the improvement among Hispanic/Latino (a 2.5 percentage point increase) and White (a 0.5 percentage point increase) students as well as those receiving special services (an increase of 0.9 to 1.5 percentage points). On the other hand, Asian, Black or African American, and those identified as Two or More Races demonstrated a one-year decrease of 0.7, 2.5, and 1.6 percentage points, respectively, continuing their downward trend between 2013 and 2016.

### Grade 1 Performance

For Grade 1 students, 59.6 percent met or exceeded the grade-level reading benchmark at Text Level 16 in 2016 (Table 2). Only one year of data is reported due to the addition of the written comprehension portion for Grade 1 benchmark requirements, as previously discussed. The 2016 Grade 1 AP-PR results will be used as a baseline for the coming school years, rather than being compared with the results of previous years.

In 2016, more than 70 percent of Grade 1 Asian, White, and students identified as Two or More Races attained the grade-level reading benchmark on AP-PR, while 55 percent of Black or African American students and less than 45 percent of Hispanic/Latino students and those receiving special services did so (Table 2).

### Grade 2 Performance

In 2016, 70.1 percent of Grade 2 students met or exceeded the grade-level reading benchmark at Text Level M, a 1.7 percentage point decrease from 2015 (71.8 percent) following a slight but positive turnaround in 2015 (Figure 1 and Table 3). The one-year decrease was mainly contributed by the continued downward trend among Black or African American students (a 4.7 percentage point decrease) and those identified as Two or More Races (a 6.6 percentage point decrease), consistent with the declination from 2013 to 2016 for these two student groups. Hispanic/Latino students displayed a one percentage point decrease, less than the decrease in prior years. In the meantime, the one-year change in 2016 in the percentage of students achieving the grade-level reading benchmark remained similar for White students and increased 0.9 percentage points for Asian students, remaining the upward trend from 2013 to 2016 in these groups. While LEP students and those receiving FARMS

services continued to exhibit a decrease by more than 2 percentage points in grade-level benchmark attainment, special education students had a halt (a 0.4 percentage point increase) of the downward trend in prior years.
