Subject: Montgomery Virtual Academy (04-07-2022-02-A, C)

During the *Digital Learning and Innovation* discussion, Board members requested the following information:

Question:

A. Ms. Harris requested information regarding the 18.4% of parents who responded that they were not satisfied with the Virtual Academy.

Response:



In reference slide 19 shown above, it is important to note that 18.4% of parents/guardians did not indicate they were not satisfied with the Montgomery Virtual Academy (MVA). When asked how satisfied they were with their child's experience in the MVA, 81.6% of responding parents/guardians reported they were very satisfied or satisfied with their student's experience in the MVA. Approximately thirteen percent of respondents (12.5%) responded 'neutral' when asked how satisfied they were with their student's experience, while only 4.3% reported they were dissatisfied/very dissatisfied. A small fraction of parents/guardians (1.6%) did not respond to the question. Demographic information was not collected for survey respondents.

Question:

C. Ms. Silvestre requested information regarding the levels of Asian and Black/African American students signing up for the Virtual Academy. What were the enrollment numbers at the commencement of the Virtual Academy versus current enrollment numbers?

Response:

Since the beginning of the 2021–2022 school year, Asian and Black/African American students have represented just more than one-half of the total enrollment in the MVA. As the school year started in August 2021, the MVA was 24.07% Asian and 30.69% Black/African American for a combined total of 54.76%. Since that time, the percentage of Asian students has decreased 4% to 19.99% and the percentage of Black/African American students has increased to 33.33% for a combined total of 53.32%.

Looking ahead to next school year, of the students who have recommitted to the MVA, 18.85% are Asian and 33.65% are Black/African American for a combined total of 52.5%. With the new applicants to MVA for the 2022–2023 school year, there appears to be a reduced percentage of Asian students applying (10.71%), however, the percentage of Black/African American students applying (31.49%) is similar to the 2021–2022 school year. The combined total of Asian and Black/African American applicants is 42.2% at this time.

A summary overview of the racial demographics of the MVA enrollment, recommitment, and new applications is included in the attached file.
