- 1. Policy proposals or changes that are required by the adoption of this Success for Every Student
- 2. A detailed plan for implementation that provides for full participation and involvement of parents, community members, teachers, and other staff
- 3. A comprehensive evaluation and accountability plan that will permit the Board and the community to understand the effectiveness with which the plan is being implemented.

Re: CHANGES IN SUCCESS FOR EVERY STUDENT

Board members agreed to the following:

- 1. PSAT would be included everywhere SAT was mentioned.
- 2. The implementation plan would contain a clearer indication of how the Board's goals were related to the strategies.

3. In response to issues raised about students with disabilities, Board members agreed that there was consensus to add some of these issues. Staff was to provide suggested language and bring the changes to the Board. Success for Every Student would then be amended to include these recommended changes.

1.4.4 Staff will identify successful early intervention strategies currently being used in schools that have prevented students from needing a higher level of special education services. This information would be disseminated to other schools.

RESOLUTION NO. 4-92 Re: AN AMENDMENT TO SUCCESS FOR EVERY STUDENT

On motion of Mr. Ewing seconded by Mrs. Fanconi, the following resolution was adopted unanimously:

<u>Resolved</u>, That Success for Every Student be amended to substitute the following for 2.7.3:

OIPD will identify and recommend for implementation those recommended strategies contained in the MCPS report, "Educational Technology: Planning for the 21st Century," presented to the Board of Education on October 8, 1991, that would be useful in implementing the Success for Every Student plan. Beginning July 1992.

- 4. The charts on pages 25 to 31 would have written identifications of goals and strategies so that people would not have to refer back to the main document.
- 5. Asian-American and American Indian would be added where

appropriate in the section on Data Collection.
