• Jungle Safari: Saturday, September 7 at 11:00 AM, for ages 5-12:

Our Eco safari guide will lead participants through a series of high-energy, excitement-packed, hair-raising, tests of wills and a series of challenges and dares, to face their fears, practice their teamwork, and put their determination to the test! Hold a giant hissing cockroach, wrangle a croc, hold a furry, spiky creature, do a physical challenge, or eat a bug??...YIKES and YUCK...no one said that this was going to be easy!

• My First Book Club: Wednesday, September 11, 4:30-5:30 PM (every second Wednesday of the month), for ages Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grade:

Are you just beginning to read on your own? Are you in Kindergarten, 1st or 2nd grade? Join White Oak's My First Book Club! Every month we will read a book together, talk about it, and do a few fun activities. **This program does not teach students how to read.** Rather we will introduce kids to some awesome books for emerging readers, get them excited about books and reading, and help them develop social skills through interacting with their peers.

Registration is required and opens September 4. Participation is limited to children in Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grades. This is an independent learning experience. Parents and caregivers will not be present in the program room but must remain in the library building during the program.

• Tween Time: Wednesday, September 18, 4:00-5:00 PM, (every third Wednesday of the month) for ages 10-13 years:

Get in on the fun with Tween Time, where we'll stretch our imaginations and get creative in a monthly program just for 10-13 year olds. Some months we'll do a craft to take home, sometimes it will be a service project to donate.

Registration is required and opens September 11. Participation is limited to 10-13-year-olds.

• Act It Out: Thursday, September 19 6:00-7:00 PM (every third Thursday of the month), for ages 1st, 2nd and 3rd grade:

First, we'll read the story, then we'll act it out! FOR GRADES 1-3. What's better than reading a good story? Acting it out! Join in the fun as we turn a great story into an original play. We'll discuss plot, theme, and characters, then band together to bring the story to life, with giggles and fun along the way. No written scripts; we'll create our dialogue and movement as we go! Acting out a story helps young readers practice skills of listening and reading comprehension. **Registration is required and opens September 9th. Intended for 1st - 3rd graders.**

This is an independent creative learning experience. Parents and caregivers will not be present in the program room but must remain in the library building during the program.

Build It! Friday, September 20 4:30-5:30 PM (for ages 6-13 years)

Join us for some fun building opportunities! We will have Legos, Duplos, Lincoln Logs, and more. We will provide all the materials for this program.
