Kindergarten

In unit 2, kindergarten students will learn about the *five senses*. They will focus on the following language development skills:

- identify body parts associated with each sense
- identify key details in a text
- expand sentences by using prepositional phrases
- identify new meanings for multiple-meaning words
- connect two short sentences into one longer sentence
- ask and answer wh- questions



First Grade

First graders will learn about the **human body** in unit 2 while going over the following language development skills:

- determine multiple meanings of a word
- use adjectives to expand noun phrases
- distinguish between controllable and uncontrollable actions
- construct sentences using conjunctions
 use linking words and
- use linking words and phrases to describe processes in the body

Second Grade

Second graders will finish up unit 2, which focuses on **early Asian civilizations** and then will move into unit 3, focusing on the **ancient Greek civilization**. They will work on the following skills:

- use regular and irregular past tense verbs
- identify antonyms of vocabulary words
- add descriptive details to sentences
- plan a fictional narrative using story elements



Third Grade

Third grade students will spend the first half of the month finishing up their learning on **animal classification** and then will move into unit 3, which is about the **human body** and the **senses**. They will learn to:

- condense clauses to form more detailed sentences
- identify the function of pronouns in writing
- apply a logical sequential order to a set of sentences
- use adjectives to expand nouns into noun phrases

Fourth graders are learning about **Empires in the Middle Ages** this month. Lords, serfs, knights, castles, manors, and towns, as well as battles and monarchs will be discussed in our texts.

Students will strengthen their language skills, learning more prefixes, adjectives, and adverbs.



Fourth Grade

Students are writing informative pieces during this unit including paraphrasing information from texts; assessing information to form an opinion; and drafting a persuasive paragraph.

Fifth Grade

Fifth graders are learning about **Early American Civilizations**: Maya, Aztec, and Inca. In our reader, students will study the geographic location, way of life, developments, and downfall of each civilization.

Students will create a Codex Project in which they compare all three civilizations through writing and images! Language and grammar will be strengthened through daily exercises and activities.
