#### **New: Smart Watches**

Over the past two weeks we have had students using smartwatches to contact their parents for various needs. While students are allowed to have smartwatches or cell phones on campus, these devices can not be used during the school day.

- If your child needs to contact you or requires assistance, they should go directly to the front office.
  - The office staff is equipped to handle their needs and facilitate communication with parents, maintaining a consistent and secure environment for all students.
- There should be no smart watches and/or cell phones used during arrival, instructional time, lunch/recess, dismissal, and before/after school activities.
- Students will be asked to remove a smartwatch that distracts themselves or others from learning or otherwise causes unwelcome attention.
  - If these rules are not followed, the device will be confiscated and returned only to the student's parent or guardian.
  - The school is not responsible if the watch/phone is lost or stolen.

# New: Integrated Pest Management Annual Notification

Maryland laws and regulations for Integrated Pest Management (IPM) in Maryland public schools require that:

- Notification be sent home to parents/guardians of each student attending the school and distributed to all staff members each school year.
- Pesticide and herbicide applications within MCPS are applied only as a last resort or in an emergency situation, and only by licensed and registered pest control applicators.
- If at any time a pesticide application becomes necessary, IPM staff will inform you and provide the necessary written notifications to be sent home with students.
