

Testing Continued...

(NEXT GENERATION) ACCUPLACER

- Tests knowledge of HS content: Arithmetic, Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics, Advanced Algebra and Functions, Reading, and Writing
- Measures student readiness for credit bearing college courses.
 - Multiple choice
 - Determines course placement, NOT admission
 - Untimed

Students should take at least one test before the end of junior year.

Mean?

The best advantage to take is applying to colleges that have Early Action Deadlines (not all schools offer this)





DEFINITIONS OF ADMISSION OPTIONS IN HIGHER EDUCATION

STUDENTS: WHICH COLLEGE ADMISSION PROCESS BEST SUITS YOU?

Regular Decision

DEFINITION:

Students submit an application by a specified date and receive a decision in a clearly stated period of time.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Rolling Admission

DEFINITION:

Institutions review applications as they are submitted and render admission decisions throughout the admission cycle.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Early Action (EA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply early and receive a decision well in advance of the institution's regular response date.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Early Decision (ED)

DEFINITION:

Students make
a commitment to
a first-choice institution where, if
admitted they definitely will enroll and
withdraw all other
applications. The
application deadline
and decision deadline occur early.

COMMITMENT:

BINDING

Restrictive Early Action (REA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply to an institution of preference and receive a decision early. They may be restricted from applying ED or EA or REA to other institutions. If offered enrollment, they have until May 1 to confirm.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Students are not restricted from applying to other institutions and have until May 1 to consider their options and confirm enrollment.

Students are responsible for determining and following restrictions.



What is important to understand now???



At the end of your Junior year:

- Your GPA and Grades you finish with will be what the college/universities you apply to will use to evaluate you (9th, 10th, & 11th)
- If during senior year you are still listed as a junior, you will not be able to submit your transcripts until you are updated as a senior
- ☐ Put together your college list and mark the ones that will require you to submit your SAT/ACT test scores
- ☐ Create Common App account & match account with Naviance
- ☐ Complete Self-Reflection Questions (counselors write your letter of recommendation)
- Optional: Students that get fee waivers for college applications have free and reduced lunch. Students can apply to be eligible.

During your Senior year:

- Ask teachers for letters of recommendation
- Finalize College List (pick both in and out of state schools)
- ☐ Have College Essay written & ready to submit
- Register for College Rep Visits on Naviance
- Submit Transcript Requests for colleges/universities
 - Only the first 5 transcripts are free, any additional is \$3.25
- Complete AEHS College Application Submission Form
- Submit college applications online (seniors do not wait for your counselor or teacher to submit your letter)
- ☐ Meet Early Action Deadlines!
 - Oct 15, Nov 1, Nov 15, Dec 1
- Colleges don't have access to 1st quarter grades (only when requested by university)
- Colleges will review mid-year grades at the end of 1st semester






Career Clusters on Naviance
