Are you interested in starting a career in the healthcare field? The Primary Care Coalition Nexus Montgomery program can help pay for your training at Montgomery College to become a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)/Geriatric Nursing Assistant. CNAs and GNAs are an important part of the health care team. This training can be a great first step in your healthcare career path! When you graduate from this 3-month, evening class, PCC will

connect you to a rewarding job at a Montgomery County hospital or healthcare organization. PCC scholarship classes start enrolling in late 2024 for 2025 classes. Classes are FREE!

About the scholarship: With grant funds from the U.S. Department of Labor, PCC will pay your tuition and fees up front. You pay some participation expenses, and when you finish the course, we pay a stipend that covers most expenses! Scholarship recipients agree to work at a hospital or nursing home in Montgomery County when they finish. All students start with a **required Zoom**

orientation session to learn about career choices and details about this program. Other training classes might also be available. If you were trained as a nurse in another country or have other college level training, we encourage you to apply!

About the CNA/GNA training: As a CNA or GNA, you can work in hospitals, physician's offices, home care agencies, and schools. You will earn a Montgomery College certificate in about 12 weeks going to school on evenings and weekends. Students will have an opportunity to work with real patients in a hospital under the supervision of a registered nurse (RN).

Qualifications for CNA training scholarships: To participate, first sign up for an orientation. After orientation, you can fill out an intake form, have a phone interview, and submit a resume. You must be 18 or older, live in Montgomery County, have work authorization, have a high school degree or equal, and NOT be a full-time student or in other training. For Montgomery College you must have health insurance and pass an entrance test. You will get a criminal background check and obtain CPR training before starting clinical work, and there will be healthcare/vaccination requirements. You must read/speak enough English to study and take the certification test in English. English classes are available for FREE.
