

Application Components - Admissions Criteria


- GPA, Courses & Grades
- Admission Tests
 - SAT, ACT
- Extracurricular Activities/Service
- Essay
- Letters of Recommendation





The Transcript

- High School Transcripts include both weighted and unweighted GPA.
- Middle School courses are listed, but may or may not be part of the GPA depending if the mark helps or hurts the overall GPA.
- Students typically apply to college without any senior year grades reported on the transcript.
- Students who took Montgomery College coursework should plan to also send their MC transcript to colleges as part of their application.





Admissions Tests: SAT vs. ACT

SAT

- Offered by College Board
- Scores between 400–1600
- Reading, Writing and Language, and Math sections
- No Science section
- Calculator allowed on only a portion of the math test
- 3 hours

ACT

- Offered by ACT
- Scores between 1–36
- English, Reading, Math & Science sections
- Calculator allowed on all math sections
- 2 hours 55 minutes + optional 40 minute writing test
- Beginning in April 2025, students who choose to take the ACT **online** will see an updated format that's shorter and lets you choose whether to include the science section. **Paper** version of new format begins in September.



Admissions Tests: SAT and ACT

Preparation

- College Test Prep class at NW
- Prep book
- Khan Academy
- Paid prep courses or tutoring

Registration

- Juniors should take a test for the first time in winter/spring of junior year
- Register for Saturday tests on College Board or ACT website
- Students who are eligible for free or reduced-price lunch are eligible for a fee waiver (contact your counselor or Ms. Davis in the College/Career Center)

Extracurricular Activities/Service

What do you do when you are not in class or studying?

- School clubs
- Sports
- Clubs/organizations outside of school
- Summer or part-time jobs
- Summer academic programs
- Volunteer activities
- Internships
- Hobbies





Essay

- Common App and Coalition App both offer options for the essay topic
- Supplemental essays
- Suggestions:
 - Share something about you that is not found elsewhere in your application
 - Have 1-2 other people read it to give you feedback
 - Start early!



Recommendation Letters

- 1 or 2 teacher letters and counselor recommendation
- Teachers from 11th or 12th grade preferred
- Core subject areas preferred
- Ask teachers personally if they will write your letter before you list them in Naviance
- Ask your teacher(s) at the end of spring semester
- Provide thorough answers on your brag sheet (in Naviance under Surveys)
- Supplemental recommendations may be accepted but cannot replace required recommendations
- Thank your recommenders



Creating your College List

- Look at a minimum of 10 schools seriously
- Discuss with parents/guardians, teachers, counselor, and friends
- Look at websites, college social media accounts, and virtual tours
- Attend virtual or in-person college fairs (NACAC College Fair is April 8)
- Communicate with college reps at admissions presentations or via Naviance
- Speak with current college students
- Visit college campuses
- Include at least one safety school



 - Dig deeper into colleges of interest using tools like Acceptance History
- Develop your Prospective College list
- Resume
- Brag Sheet




Naviance Scattergrams

Things To Do: Spring 2025

- Earn the best grades you can this semester to boost your GPA
- Review next year's course selections and email your counselor with any changes by June 1
- Research colleges and narrow down your list
 - Think about what is important to you
 - Complete an online college search
 - Attend NACAC College Fair (April 8)
 - Visit college campuses



Things To Do: Spring 2025

- Plan for College Admissions tests
 - SAT dates: May 3, June 7 (must register online)
 - ACT dates: April 5, June 14, July 12 (must register online)
- Ask 1–2 teachers to write your college recommendations
- Complete Northwest Brag Sheet in Naviance in Surveys



Things To Do: Summer 2025

- Start your applications (many are available beginning August 1st)
 - oCommon App, Coalition App, Black Common App, university-specific application
 - oRegular Decision vs. Early Decision vs. Early Action vs. Priority vs. Rolling Admission
 - oCommon App vs. Coalition App vs. E-docs vs. U.S. Mail
- Develop a system for keeping track of your applications
- Register with the <u>NCAA Eligibility Center</u> if you are planning to play a
 Division I or II sport



Things To Do: Summer 2025

- Develop a resume of your work, volunteer, and extracurricular activities
- Write your college essay(s)
- Research scholarship opportunities
 - Northwest HS College & Career Website
 - Scholarships.com
 - FastWeb



Things To Do: Summer 2025

Utilize your Northwest & MCPS resources:

- Counselors are available over the summer to support students with the college application process.
- Counselors can assist students in identifying their remaining graduation requirements, discussing post-secondary plans, and reviewing the Brag Sheet.
- Please email your counselor directly with any questions.



Things To Do: Fall 2025

- Take or retake tests (SAT, ACT)
- Finalize your list of colleges you are applying to in "Colleges I'm Thinking About" section in Naviance
- 6-10 colleges including target, safety, and reach schools
- Complete and submit a release of records form
- Complete and submit a transcript request form for all colleges at least 15 school days before application deadline
- Sign up to attend college rep visits at Northwest on Naviance





Things To Do: Fall 2025

- List your teacher recommenders in Naviance at least 3 weeks before your deadline
- If using the Common App, match your Common App and Naviance accounts and complete FERPA waiver
- Submit college applications by deadlines
- Submit SAT and/or ACT test scores to colleges via College Board and ACT websites
- Complete FAFSA to apply for federal and state financial aid
- Maintain strong grades in high school courses—colleges will ask for your senior year grades!

Did you know about the Academic Common Market as a way to save on tuition?

What is The Academic Common Market (ACM)?: The Academic Common Market (ACM) is a tuition-awing program that operates on the premise that if public institutions (not including private institutions) in a student's home state do not offer a degree program major (undergraduate or graduate) that a student intends on pursuing, then s/he may attend a participating ACM out-of-state institution offering the degree of interest through the ACM and be granted a waiver of out-of-state tuition charges. Visit the MHEC website and select the link for Academic Common Market.

Financial Aid Tip for Maryland post-secondary applicants: Be prepared to accept Maryland state financial aid and apply for state scholarships in the fall of senior year.
