

Through a partnership with Montgomery County Public Schools and Montgomery College, high school students can take college level courses at any Montgomery College campus or thru Distance Learning during their junior and/or senior year at a reduced cost. Participation in the Early Placement Program will give students the opportunity to earn transferable college credit, learn essential skills of time management and build self-confidence as they plan for their future.

In order to be eligible, students must have the following requirements:

- Seniors are required to have a minimum 2.75 GPA
- Juniors are required to have a minimum 3.0 GPA
- Applicants must be at least 16 years of age and completed their sophomore year prior to participation in the program.
- Participants must have approval of parent (or guardian), high school counselor and principal.
- Participating juniors and seniors must meet the required score on the Accuplacer (a computerized placement exam) and/or:
  - SAT score of 550 or higher score on critical reading and/or math
  - ACT score of 24 or higher on math and/or English
