NOVEMBER CONFERENCES

November 25th and 26th are early release days before Thanksgiving. On November 25th, North Bethesda Middle School will hold conference day. Due to the large student population, we are unable to offer individual conferences for all families. This year, team conferences are by invitation only and will be held from 3:30 to 6:30 p.m., either on Zoom or in person, with priority given to students needing additional academic support.

MRS. RICE'S COUNSELING UPDATE

Many refer to the middle school years as the questioning years. Who am I? What do I stand for? Where do I fit in? Tweens and teens question a lot of things, sexuality being one of them. Last week I referenced the tween dating scene and how relationships are different than when we were growing up and I encouraged you to focus on feelings. Today I want to encourage you to focus on fluidity and inquiry in regards to sexuality.

The physical changes associated with puberty typically bring about an increase in sexual feelings. Teens may find themselves having sexual feelings about someone who is the same sex as they are, or the opposite sex. Some have sexual feelings about both sexes or no preference for either sex. Sexual attraction and sexual identity are not one and the same. One can be attracted to someone of the same sex and not identify as homosexual.

Sexuality develops and changes throughout your life. In the teen years, it's important to help your teen feel comfortable about their developing body, make healthy choices about their body, understand and express feelings of intimacy, attraction and affection for others, and develop and

maintain respectful relationships. Being an open source of communication for your teen about sexuality will help them sort through the myriad of messages they receive from other sources.

Two of the most important things you can talk about with your teen are consent and safety. Consent, agreeing to something or giving permission for something to happen, is essential in healthy relationships and it is important for your child to know and understand. Safety is also essential. Your teen should know and have the tools to protect against sexually transmitted infections. Without open communication, teens may feel shame around their new sexual feelings and proceed into relationships privately and without guidance.

And what about the teen who does identify as LGBTQIA+? Feelings around sexuality can be even harder for these teens. They may feel they have to pretend to feel things they don't or hide a part of themselves to fit in with their peers or society. Fear of prejudice, rejection or bullying may lead them to keep their sexuality a secret. Teens who enter into sexual relationships in secret rarely have the guidance they need to make healthy choices and decisions. Some LGBTQIA+ teens will be accepted by their families and others will not.

At NBMS we promote acceptance of every gender and sexuality. It is important as parents that we are open and communicate acceptance around all types of sexuality as well. Remember, many teens are simply questioning who they are and in doing so will question their sexuality. As a matter of fact, they can probably name many more sexual terms than you and I can. <u>Check out this list!</u>

HARDEST MATH PROBLEM

Hardest Math Problem Contest Overview

Entry Form & Grade Level Problems

The Hardest Math Problem is an annual competition presented by The Actuarial Foundation, and the New York Life Foundation that challenges grades 6–8 students to solve multistep, grade-appropriate math problems with real-world situations and engaging characters.

Challenge 1 - Now until December 4th: Every student who provides a mathematically correct answer to Challenge 1 will receive an invitation to compete in Challenge 2 with an even more difficult problem. Turn your paper in to your Math Teacher or Ms. Watkins by Wednesday December 4th. Challenge 2 - By Invitation to Challenge 1 Winners, January-March, 2025

Entries must contain a mathematically correct answer and a compelling written explanation of their reasoning to be eligible for the Grand Prize! Correct entries are judged by a panel of teachers and actuaries to determine the strongest written argument and award prizes.

3 Grand Prize Winners (one per grade): \$3,000 for a 529 college savings plan, plus a laptop!

3 Runner-Up Winners (one per grade): \$2,000 for a 529 college savings plan and a tablet computer.

3 Honorable Mentions (one per grade): \$1,000 contribution to a 529 college savings plan. Teachers can win a \$300 gift card and \$200 towards a class pizza party!

ATTENDANCE

TO REPORT AN ABSENCE Call the Attendance Line at 240-740-2101 by 9 a.m. or send an excuse note by email.

Upon return to school, send a note to the main office: include student's full name, grade, dates, and reason for absence. You can use this <u>Attendance Note</u> template for Absences, Tardies, or Early Dismissals. **MCPS requires a doctor's note for absences of 5 days or more.** For an absence of 3 days or longer, homework may be requested by calling the Counseling Office at 240-740-2110.

Teachers enter attendance for each period into Synergy, the attendance system. All class absences generate an automated call/email to parents. If you believe there is an error, please contact the teacher and the attendance office.

CAFETERIA FEES

It may be necessary to periodically review the cafeteria balance and funding source on your student's account to check for accuracy and for appropriate monetary funds. As a reminder, a traditional school lunch is \$2.80, but students have the option to purchase additional a la carte items for additional purchase. We find it appropriate for you to review with your child expectations

and norms around cafeteria spending, and to support them in establishing boundaries and budgeting accordingly. We do not want any surprises for you and your child in terms of their daily spending. Prepay and check your child's account at <u>www.myschoolbucks.com</u> This service is optional—schools will continue to accept checks and cash for meals in the cafeteria.

FREE and REDUCED MEALS

Students in Maryland who qualify for reduced-price meals will not be charged for meals.

- Federal eligibility guidelines change each school year; therefore, a new application must be submitted each school year. All students in the family should be listed on one household application. A notice will be mailed home to each student if you are approved for meal benefits or do not qualify for meal benefits. Please keep this important document for your records and use throughout the school year. Families may apply for meal benefits at any time during the school year.
- Households that are unable to apply online should contact their school or the Division of Food and Nutrition Services at 240-740-7400. If you would like a paper application, please contact the main office.
