## Meet Dr. Stephen Lorenz

Dr. Stephen Lorenz earned his PhD in American Studies from George Washington University in 2014, focusing on Civil Rights and Cultural History. He graduated cum laude with a degree in English from Washington College in Chestertown, Maryland.

As a cultural historian and audio archivist, Dr. Lorenz has lectured at various institutions, including the DC Historical Society, where he has presented on archive research, civil rights, and the music history of Washington, D.C. He has written on the history of Black cowboys, and edited books on blues and bluegrass music and is co-author on a forthcoming book on performing arts in D.C., *Capital Acts*, set for release this November.

His technical skills and expertise in vernacular culture led him to do digital preservation work for the Smithsonian's Center for Folklife and Cultural Heritage and to assist in producing albums for Smithsonian Folkways Records. For over 20 years, he has documented the Smithsonian's Folklife Festival, capturing music and oral histories from participants around the globe. This experience has given him unique insights into the diverse histories, arts, music, and culinary traditions of cultures worldwide, experiences he hopes to bring to the classroom. Additionally, he serves as the neighborhood archivist for the historic mid-century homes designed by Charles M. Goodman in Kensington.

Dr. Lorenz is passionate about bringing his rich learning and teaching experiences to the Social Studies curriculum at NBMS. As a parent of three children in Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS)—spanning elementary, middle, and high school—he is keenly aware of the challenges parents face in ensuring a safe and enriching learning environment for their children.

For the past year, Dr. Lorenz has worked as a paraeducator with the Social Studies staff at NBMS, providing instructional support and integrating effective teaching practices learned from outstanding MCPS educators. He is excited to leverage his educational and professional experiences in teaching 6th and 7th grade World Studies. With his background in music, he also looks forward to co-teaching the 7th and 8th grade Chorus.

## Meet Ms. Sofia Rehrig

Sofia Rehrig is a recent graduate of Kenyon College in Gambier, Ohio where she obtained a B.A. in molecular biology. Her science background and subject area knowledge include 3 years of undergraduate research in plant genomics, and she continues to contribute to an ongoing National Science Foundation funded project.

As a former MCPS student and graduate of Bethesda-Chevy Chase High School, she is thrilled to be returning to the school system that first sparked her love for science education. ## NOVEMBER CONFERENCES

## MRS. RICE'S COUNSELING UPDATE

When we return to school on Wednesday, a new President will have been elected. We are anxiously waiting to see how another contentious election will end. Chances are that your preteen or teen is also waiting, and hoping, like most of us, that things will change. Although they are too young to vote, they likely have an opinion and have followed some political news. Many wish there was a way to voice their choice.

With so much talk about plans for our country, many children will have questions about the future; some will speak them and others will hold them inside. They may be wondering what will happen after the election, how will things change, how soon will things change, what if my candidate of choice loses? As parents, we have many of the same questions and it's easy for us to show our children our own anxiety. But, remember that your child looks to you as a role model and it can be helpful to purposefully create a sense of optimism (even if you aren't feeling optimistic.)

You can help your child feel optimistic by pointing out that our country has been through rough patches before, and we will find a way through it again. You may want to do some research together and look at the long history of elections and change in our country. It's also important to remind your child that the country is made up of the government and its people and when the people don't see eye to eye with the government, the people can move to start the work that needs to be done by volunteering and getting involved. Stopping to listen to your child might be the most valuable lesson you can teach. When politics is taking over news feeds and adult conversation, friends and peers often find themselves on opposite sides of the path. Listening to each other teaches us that it's okay for individuals to have differing opinions and we should not

attack anyone for having a belief different then our own. We should listen and learn from one another and together work to make this country a better place for all.

#### Hardest Math Problem Contest Overview

#### Entry Form & Grade Level Problems

Entries must contain a mathematically correct answer and a compelling written explanation of their reasoning to be eligible for the Grand Prize! Correct entries are judged by a panel of teachers and actuaries to determine the strongest written argument and award prizes.

3 Grand Prize Winners (one per grade): \$3,000 for a 529 college savings plan, plus a laptop! 3 Runner-Up Winners (one per grade): \$2,000 for a 529 college savings plan and a tablet computer. 3 Honorable Mentions (one per grade): \$1,000 contribution to a 529 college savings plan. ## ATTENDANCE

## TO REPORT AN ABSENCE Call the Attendance Line at 240-740-2101 by 9 a.m. or send an excuse note by email.

Upon return to school, send a note to the main office: include student's full name, grade, dates, and reason for absence. You can use this <u>Attendance Note</u> template for Absences, Tardies, or Early Dismissals. **MCPS requires a doctor's note for absences of 5 days or more.** For an absence of 3 days or longer, homework may be requested by calling the Counseling Office at 240-740-2110.

Teachers enter attendance for each period into Synergy, the attendance system. All class absences generate an automated call/email to parents. If you believe there is an error, please contact the teacher and the attendance office.

## **CAFETERIA FEES**

It may be necessary to periodically review the cafeteria balance and funding source on your student's account to check for accuracy and for appropriate monetary funds. As a reminder, a traditional school lunch is \$2.80, but students have the option to purchase additional a la carte items for additional purchase. We find it appropriate for you to review with your child expectations and norms around cafeteria spending, and to support them in establishing boundaries and budgeting accordingly. We do not want any surprises for you and your child in terms of their daily spending. Prepay and check your child's account at <u>www.myschoolbucks.com</u> This service is optional—schools will continue to accept checks and cash for meals in the cafeteria.

Support Call the Schoolbucks toll-free customer support center at 1-855-832-5226 for assistance with enrollment or questions about your account. MySchoolBucks support staff are available Monday to Friday, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. eastern standard time.

## FREE and REDUCED MEALS

Students in Maryland who qualify for reduced-price meals will not be charged for meals.

Applications: Free and Reduced-price Meals System (FARMS) applications have been updated for the new school year and are now available online at www.MySchoolApps.com; this is the preferred application method.

- Federal eligibility guidelines change each school year; therefore, a new application must be submitted each school year. All students in the family should be listed on one household application. A notice will be mailed home to each student if you are approved for meal benefits or do not qualify for meal benefits. Please keep this important document for your records and use throughout the school year. Families may apply for meal benefits at any time during the school year.
- Households that are unable to apply online should contact their school or the Division of Food and Nutrition Services at 240-740-7400. If you would like a paper application, please contact the main office.
