Last day of school

This a reminder that the last day of school for the students will be Thursday, June 13, 2024. Students will be dismissed at 12:30pm. Please make arrangements if students do not take the school bus to be picked up by 12:30pm.

Eighth Grade End of the Year Information

On Monday, June 10, 2024 we will have our second promotion practice for 8th grade students. Please make sure that your child arrives at school on time, practice begins promptly at 8:30am. Students should report to homeroom no later than 8:15am. Students will receive their promotion tickets at the end of the practice. All obligations must be cleared by the end of the day for students to receive their tickets. Students must participate in promotion practice to attend the promotion ceremony.

If you have any questions please reach out to Ms. Kelly or Ms. Killebrew, our 8th grade team leads. Please read the <u>End of Year.ENG</u> document with detailed information about promotion (how tickets will be distributed, etc.) and end of year activities for students. Please note that in order for the students to participate in the end of year activities all financial obligations must be paid and behavioral expectations must be met.

Eighth Grade Promotion, Tuesday, June 11, 2024

The 8th promotion will take place at Kennedy High School on Tuesday, June 11, 2024. Students should report directly to Kennedy High School no later than 8:30am. Students may arrive as early as 8:00 am. The ceremony will begin promptly at 9:00am, students who arrive late may miss the opportunity to enter the auditorium with their class. You are encouraged to park in the Kennedy parking garage. Family members must have their tickets to enter the auditorium.

Standing Items of Interest		

Chromebooks	Odessa Shannon will have Chromebook Carts with class sets of Chromebook available for student use in the classroom. For students who need a device to use at home, students, parents, and MCPS staff can fill out the <u>Student Home Use Chromebook</u> <u>Request</u> form on behalf of the student. The student's information will be verified for take-home device eligibility, and then a Chromebook will be sent to the school to be checked out to the student. Students will not be required to transport home-use Chromebooks to and from school.
Cell Phone/Electronics Policy	OSMS follows the county's expectations for cell phone non-use during the school day. Students are allowed to have cell phones at OSMS; however, it is highly encouraged they stay at home. If a student brings a cell phone/electronics of any kind to school to school, they must be turned off and out of sight during the instructional day, this includes lunch time and in the halls. We suggest and highly encourage students to keep phones/electronics at home or in their own locker during the school day. Please note that the school is NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR LOST OR STOLEN ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT and a parent may have to pick up phones/electronics if they become an instructional distraction for the student.
Bell Times and School Attendance	Bell Schedule Regular school attendance is required. Students are expected to report to school on time and be prepared each day. The school day is from 8:10am-3:00pm. If students are not able to attend classes, please email Ms. Johana Martinez, attendance secretary, at Johana_S_Martinez/@mcpsmd.org. Students should bring in a note upon their return to school regarding their absence to adjust their attendance correctly. A written explanation of each absence is required from the parent/guardian within three days of the student's return to school. You will receive an automated call whenever your student is out for one period or the whole day. Please check with your student before calling the school because the main office cannot verify if they were in class at that specific time frame. Students are not supervised in the building until 7:50 a.m., therefore students should not be dropped off before this time as it is a safety concern. Students will remain outside until 7:50 a.m. We will have a new student drop off area that is marked, please drop off students in the designated area only. Finally, to ensure that students receive the maximum instructional time, students will not be called out of class for messages and parents should avoid conflicts that interfere with class attendance as much as possible.
ParentVUE Activation	Please take the time to register for ParentVUE. This school year, Synergy and ParentVUE will be the primary home-to-school communication vehicles for schools to share information regarding grades, attendance, scheduling, log into myMCPS Classroom, and more. 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myMCPS Classroom/Canvas	The myMCPS-Canvas platform will continue to be used for teaching and learning during the school year. Students will access their assignments, receive messages, and use this platform to turn in work as appropriate. *Parents/Guardians can access myMCPS Classroom via ParentVUE
Lockers	All students will be assigned a locker during the first week of school. Please note that backpacks and other bags need to fit within the locker space because students will not be allowed to carry bags to class. In many cases a luggage style bag with wheels and a pull handle will not fit, so please save your receipts in case a newly purchased bag needs to be returned.
Conflict Resolution Program at School	The Conflict Resolution Center of Montgomery County (CRCMC), is excited to offer a school based conflict resolution program this year. Staff and volunteers from the Conflict Resolution Center of Montgomery County will conduct this exciting program here at Odessa Shannon MS one day a week.
	The purpose of this school-based conflict resolution program is to provide the students and staff of Odessa Shannon MS the opportunity to address and resolve student disputes with an "on-site" conflict resolution professional. The program will empower students to use the on-site Conflict Resolution Office to address and resolve disputes in constructive ways supporting a positive and safe learning environment. Additionally, students will practice restorative discipline principles that focus on: strengthening relationships, collaborative problem-solving, and student accountability.
	This on-site school-based Conflict Resolution Program will be housed in the counseling office. The office will be staffed by AmeriCorps and Volunteers with the Conflict Resolution Center of Montgomery County who will serve as a neutral person to accept concerns on behalf of students, teachers, and staff regarding student concerns. The position will be staffed by personnel from the Conflict Resolution Center of Montgomery County and will provide individual conferencing, community conferencing, and mediation.
