Target audience: grades 10-11

ASVAB (Career Assessment Inventory) Testing

Target audience: grades 10-12
The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery is a 3-hour assessment and is most the widely used of its kind in the world. It assesses a student's ability to learn new skills and is a predictor of success in training and education programs. The test scores provide a snapshot of current knowledge and skills and can be compared with the educational or job requirements for occupations of interest.
