Credit Courses

Please be aware of the following pieces of information when signing up for credit courses through the Local Summer School and Prep Program. Each of the courses that are being offered for credit are offered twice during the summer.

Below you will find courses offerings, descriptions, dates of sessions, cost and deadlines for registration.

Honors Health

Students learn factual health information in the following content areas: mental and emotional health; alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs; personal and consumer health; family life and human sexuality; safety and injury prevention; and disease prevention and control. Students develop lifelong health skills such as accessing information, advocacy, analyzing influences, communication skills, conflict resolution, decision making, goal setting, practicing healthful behaviors, refusal skills and stress management throughout the course. Although this course is required for graduation, parental permission must be specifically provided for students under the age of 18 to participate in the family life and human sexuality and disease prevention and control units.

Honors Geometry A/B

Geometry formalizes and extends students' geometric experiences from the elementary and middle school grades. Students explore more complex geometric situations and deepen their understanding of geometric relationships, progressing toward formal mathematical arguments. Instruction at this level will focus on the understanding and application of congruence as a basis for developing formal proofs; the relationships among similarity, trigonometry and triangles; the relationships between two- and three-dimensional objects and their measurements; exploration of geometric descriptions and equations for conic sections; and application of geometric concepts in modeling situations.

AP and HONORS CHEMISTRY PREP

Intended for new AP and Honors Chemistry students. It focuses on introducing the fundamental concepts, both chemical and mathematical, needed for both curriculums. The class will split to focus on subject class appropriate concerns, with both groups being exposed to the first month of the curriculum for each class, allowing for dedicated group work and problem solving in a low stress, hands-on, low student-to-teacher ratio environment.
